Cooperation

By working together the United Nations and regional organizations can strengthen existing platforms for regional dialogue on security and arms control.



Inclusivity

Greater efforts are needed to achieve equal, full and effective participation of women in all decision-making processes related to disarmament.





More education and training opportunities should be established, in order to empower young people to be a force for change and

disarmament.

Finally, there must be **better engagement** and **integration** of experts, industry and civil society representatives into disarmament.
